

Software firm converges on capital

Auckland software firm Convergence is opening a Wellington office this week to drum up more business in the capital.

Chief executive Mark Presnell says the company has eyed a Wellington presence for eight months, since starting work on a Lotus Notes project for the Police.

Convergence has a wide brief, covering IT consulting, Web design, training, software development and IT support.

"We see significant potential for the services we offer in the capital," Mr Presnell says.

The nine-year-old company has 20 staff in Auckland but only three in Wellington. Its only client here is the Police.

Convergence also resells the products of its sister company, Ability Software, which makes software add-ons for IBM's Lotus suite of products.
